Sermon Discussion Questions

The Book for Which God's People Stood
Nehemiah 8

1. How do you understand your relationship with the Bible?
2. When you read something in the Bible that you perceive as offensive, how do you react?
3. How did the people's reaction to the reading of the Law (weeping) reflect their spiritual condition and understanding?
4. In Nehemiah 8:8, it says, "They read from the Book of the Law of God, making it clear and giving the meaning so that the people understood what was being read." How does this emphasize the importance of not just reading Scripture, but also understanding it? How do you move from just reading to understanding? When do you assume you have understood it correctly?
5. At the end of Nehemiah 8 God has the people build a symbol to remind them of who they are (flammable tents after having built a wall). What symbols could you erect that could remind you that you belong to God?
6. How can you make progress in reading and understanding God's Word in 2024?
