Sermon Discussion Questions

Justice is Love
Romans 13:8

1. Why is it so hard to talk about racial justice issues? Why do you think there is a divide amongst Christians on how to address these issues?
2. What is racism? Get really specific. Give examples. Sometimes we get defensive by saying, "I'm not racist because it was not my intention." Is that a good defense?
3. Jean-Jacques Rousseau maintained that people are naturally good but become corrupted by society's institutions. Scripture teaches we are sinners, and we corrupt society's institutions. Talk about how these two worldviews lead to different solutions to race and injustice.
4. Should the Christian view of justice be: "There is simply nothing I should do to end the injustice of because, ultimately, only God can change lives through the gospel."
5. If God's people have been reconciled across races and ethnicities, how should they be pursuing justice for each other?
6. How is American culture trying to solve racism? Is the American culture preaching truth to the church? Where is the culture going wrong?
7. The prophet Jeremiah told God's people during their exile in an unbelieving land and without the benefit of democratic means, to "seek the welfare of the city" in which they lived (Jer. 29:7). Does that moral obligation still exist today?
8. A simple way to define justice is to give people their due and what we owe people in love (Romans 13:8)? What love do we owe people that are being oppressed?
