Sermon Discussion Questions

When a Church Prays Luke 11:5-12 / Acts 4:31 / Acts 12:5

Prayer is often overlooked, unless we are eating or in distress. On top of that many times when we go to pray we find our minds begin to wander and it is difficult to stay on topic. Why do you think this is? Do you experience this kind of difficulty in prayer? Do you find prayer to be a blessing or a frustrating requirement?

As we read the parable in Luke 11 we are meant to find a point of connection. Maybe in your first reading you associate with the one in bed wanting to end the persistent knocking of a friend, or maybe you readily connect with the persistent friend having a great need that you want met. In either situation the persistence is the point. Jesus is telling us to persist in prayer...How does your approach to prayer compare with the persistence presented in the parable? How does the parable communicate a confidence we can have in prayer as well? What does Jesus promise about prayer in this parable and how should we respond to that? [See also James 4:2-3]

In other passages in the Gospels, Jesus encourages us to have deep faith in prayer (Mark 11:22-24). This encourages in us a deep confidence (Hebrews 4) in prayer as well. The Father loves us and we are encouraged to come to him with big requests. Thinking along those lines, what are some big, seemingly impossible, requests you could make of God this year? How will you be persistent in those?

When we look at Acts, we find the church praying...a lot! Consider a few passages... (Acts 1:14; 1:24-25; Acts 2:42; Acts 4:23-31; Acts 12:5,12; Acts 16:16, 25, Acts 20:36-38). How does the corporate prayer we see in the early church influence our thinking on prayer? Is prayer primarily a private act or one that is to be done with the body? Is Redeemer a praying church? If not, how can we act as a catalyst for greater prayer?

Conduct a prayer experiment this week and ask the Spirit to help you initiate two prayer times with different people.
