

Sermon Discussion Questions How to Undo a Culture's Story Acts 17:16-34

- 1. Athens seems to be an in-between stop in Paul's journey as he waits for others to join him (v16). Have you ever seen God at work during in-between times in your plans?
- 2. What motivates Paul to share the gospel (v16)?
- 3. What are things that provoke you to anger in our culture? Is your next step to complain, run, share Christ, stay mad, or something else? Discuss.
- 4. Some people have criticized this sermon and think Paul made a mistake for not being Christ-centered enough. What do you think?
- 5. Paul is not preaching but reasoning with people. What do you think the difference is?
- 6. Notice Paul's tactic here is to start with creation and then move to judgement and resurrection. Why do you think he did it this way?
- 7. Paul's tactic in Acts in speaking to Gentiles is not to quote the Bible, but to use their beliefs to show how Christ fulfills or critiques them. What do you think about laying a foundation of talking about Jesus without your Bible.
- 8. What beliefs in our own culture would you talk about with an unbeliever to bring them closer to Jesus?
- 9. Paul summarizes the response to Jesus in a number of ways throughout Acts. In this speech he doesn't call on people to believe. He just says, "repent." Why does Paul call people to respond in different ways to his message? How can he summarize what our response to God should be in this one word?
- 10. Acts 17:25 is a well-known verse on the Independence of God. What does it teach us about the independence of God?
