Sermon Discussion

Conquered Conquerors Romans 8:31-39

- 1. Each of us has a personal liturgy. Consider: What rituals and repetition have you ingrained into yourself through repetitive practices that motivates how you live and love? Are there habits and practices that we acquire without knowing it? Are there ritual forces in our culture that we perhaps naively immerse ourselves in—and are thus formed by—that, when we consider them more closely, are pointed at some ultimate end?
- 2. There is little doubt that our culture has an addiction to stimulation, input, and entertainment that prevents us from embracing the ordinary wonders of life in Christ. To illustrate, read Romans 8:31-39 slowly out loud. Do you find this to be overwhelming? Are you in a sense undone by the wonder of God's gracious goodness to us in Christ? Would this impact you more if you saw as a movie as opposed to reading it? If you don't find yourself overwhelmed by it, what is causing the dullness?
- 3. Reflect on Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:39), where He submits to the Father's will. How does this moment of surrender and the subsequent victory of the resurrection inform our understanding of Romans 8:32, "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all"?
- 4. Romans 8:31-39 speaks powerfully of God's love as being inseparable from us. How does the resurrection of Jesus Christ during Easter provide the ultimate proof of this inseparable love? Reflect on how the resurrection assures us that God is for us and not against us.
- 5. Paul imagines the Christian life as one of conquering all things through Christ. What does the opposite (defeated) life look like practically in our daily routine of life.
- 6. What are the superficial things in your life that combat the mission statement of Romans 8:31-39. How can you help each other go deep with God?
- 7. How can you put before your mind and heart each day that the Son of God loves you? Be very specific.
