

# Sermon Discussion Questions

When the Gospel Impacts the Culture *Acts 19:21-41* 

- What do you think was Luke's purpose in telling the story of the riot? Notice that no Christian speaks the entire time.
- 2. In verse 21, the Holy Spirit prompts Paul to go to Jerusalem and Rome. Compare this to Acts 16:6-10, where the Holy Spirit leads Paul to Macedonia. What do these passages reveal about the role of the Holy Spirit in guiding the life and ministry of the apostle Paul?
- 3. The opposition Paul faced in Ephesus regarding the Artemis cult can be compared to his confrontation with the idolatry in Athens (Acts 17:16-34). How do these two accounts illustrate Paul's response to idolatry?
- 4. How does the conflict with Demetrius and the craftsmen in Acts 19:23-27 demonstrate the potential impact of the gospel on individuals, industries, and social structures?
- 5. In Acts 19:28-34, Paul's companions are dragged into the theater by the angry mob. Compare this to Acts 16:19-24, where Paul and Silas are seized and beaten in Philippi. How do these instances of opposition reveal the cost of following Christ and proclaiming the gospel?
- 6. In Acts 19:29-31, Paul's friends prevent him from entering the theater during the uproar, displaying their love and concern for him. Why is it ok to sometimes not stand up and speak the truth?
- 7. Read Luke's description of the mob (Acts 19:32). Who are the modern-day mobs in the United States that spend a lot of time yelling about Christians?
- 8. The city clerk appeals to the crowd by reasoning with them from the law of the day. How might Christians be helped by similar people in authority against mobs who are trying to shut down Christians.
- Discuss the ways in which the gospel could so transform our culture that it would cause mobs to form because of the economic and social impact of transformed lives.
