Sermon Discussion Questions

The Mysterious Will of God
Acts 22:30-23:22

1. How did Paul defend himself before the Sanhedrin?
2. What does Paul's statement about his Pharisee background reveal about his strategy?
3. How did the different factions within the Sanhedrin react to Paul's defense?
4. Why do you think Paul emphasized his belief in the resurrection of the dead? Was he seeking to “share the gospel” or something different (compare to how he spoke to the crowd in Acts 22)? What might we learn from this?
5. How does Paul's experience in the Sanhedrin align with Jesus' own trials before the religious leaders? (Particularly John 18:20-23)
6. In what ways did God provide guidance and protection for Paul during his trial? How have you experienced the Lord’s guidance in difficult circumstances?
7. In Romans 15:23-29, Paul states his desire to visit Rome. This story shows us how he gets there.
 - How might his impact Paul’s confidence as he goes through his upcoming trials?
 - What do we learn about how God works to bring about his will?
 - How does the fact that this methodology was extremely difficult for Paul strike you?
