

## **Sermon Discussion Questions**

Did the Gospel Win?

Acts 28

- 1. We're done! Try to summarize the book of Acts in one sentence.
- 2. How does the reaction of the natives on the island of Malta after Paul's snakebite incident in verses 1-6 reflect the common human tendencies towards superstition and the misunderstanding of divine justice?
- 3. Reflect on Paul's imprisonment and the power at his disposal to shake off a viper bite and heal people on the island (Acts 28:7-8)
- 4. Read Philippians 1:12-13, which is written during Paul's imprisonment. How did Paul view his imprisonment? Why did it seem like a net positive? Check out Philippians 4:22 as well.
- 5. Read Paul's list of visitors (Colossians 4:7-15). What can we know about each person and their relationship to each other?
- 6. The ending here feels so abrupt (verses 30-31). Luke wrote it years after the events of Acts 28. Why does he leave us hanging?
- 7. In verse 31, Luke notes that Paul taught and preached with "all boldness" and "without hindrance". What lessons can we take from Paul's unwavering faith and perseverance in spreading the Gospel, even in the face of significant adversity?
- 8. Reflect back on the entire book. What sticks out? What have you learned? What will you take away from this series?
