Sermon Discussion Questions

The Incomparable God
Isaiah 40

1. Isaiah 40 is written to people who are despairing and despondent because everything they are experiencing tells them God is not for them (v29). What are the sources of comfort highlighted in this chapter, and how can we draw upon them in times of personal despair or difficulty?
2. Isaiah starts with “Comfort, comfort my people.” In light of the Israelites’ exile, how does understanding our own suffering deepen our appreciation for God’s promises of restoration and redemption?
3. In verses 6-8, the fleeting nature of human life is contrasted with the permanence of God’s Word. What theological implications can be drawn from this juxtaposition?
4. The chapter paints a vast picture of God’s majesty and power (verses 12-26). How does grasping the scale and grandeur of God shape our daily priorities and concerns?
5. Verses 18-20 challenge the idols made by human hands. How can we identify and combat the subtle idols of our hearts in today’s modern world?
6. The act of “waiting” in verse 31 seems passive, yet it promises empowerment. In what ways does waiting on the Lord, in trust and faith, actively transform our spiritual lives?
7. Throughout the chapter, God’s promises are evident. Which promise in this chapter resonates with you the most right now, and why?
