Sermon Discussion Questions

CONVERSION

1. Cornelius is a seeker - he wants to know God. How does God then bring the gospel to him? How has God brought the gospel to seekers that you know?
2. Peter realizes 7-8 years after he met Jesus that God does not show favoritism. What took so long? What did he have to unlearn?
3. When Peter shares the gospel with Cornelius, notice that (1) He doesn't share his testimony, and (2) He doesn't mention the Old Testament at all. Discuss why that might be the case and how it might inform how we share Christ.
4. How did Peter know Cornelius and his friends were truly converted (v44-46)? What are some marks of conversion?
5. Spirit baptism has been understood in a lot of different ways. Why do you think previous conversions (Ethiopian Eunuch, Saul) did receive the Spirit and speak in tongues, but the Gentiles do here? How is this event like Pentecost (Acts 2)?
6. Peter immediately moves to baptism (v47). Why?
7. Peter returns to Jerusalem and gets criticized. Why? What did they have to unlearn?
8. The church leaders seem more concerned about who Peter eats with rather than the blessing of God in pouring out His Spirit on those people. In their genuine desire to be holy they had a hard time believing God could save people. How does this happen?
