

Sermon Discussion Questions

When Christ Returns Revelation 22:12-21

- 1. When is the last time you thought about the return of Christ? Have you ever been more drawn to pray for the return of Christ? If so, why?
- 2. Over the last 100 years, American Christians have been obsessed with declaring when Christ will return and trying to line up current events with bible prophesy. Why the obsession?
- 3. Jesus makes it clear that no one knows the exact timing of His return (Matthew 24:36, Mark 13:32-33). How does this uncertainty affect how we live our day-to-day lives?
- 4. Revelation 22:12 emphasizes the imminence of Christ's return. How does this concept of "soon" interact with our understanding of God's eternal nature and our temporal existence?
- 5. Christ is said to bring His recompense with Him (see also Matthew 25:31-33). What does this teach us about the interplay between grace, works, and divine judgment?
- 6. Verses 14-15 refer to the Tree of Life and the exclusion from the holy city. How does this imagery connect back to Genesis? What is the point?
- 7. Verse 17 involves a call to "Come." Who are the people being invited?
- 8. Thirst is a recurring biblical metaphor for spiritual longing (Isaiah 55:1, John 7:37). How does this metaphor here in Revelation 22:17 fit into the larger biblical narrative about God's provision?
- 9. How does the prayer "Come, Lord Jesus" impact your spiritual journey? Are there ways it should reshape your priorities, relationships, or commitments?
