Sermon Discussion Questions

The Death of God Matthew 27:27-55

- 1. Read all the varied reactions at the foot of the cross in this passage that range from mockery to awe (soldiers, religious leaders, the crowd, the criminals. How have you seen each of these kind of responses in your interaction with people?
- 2. Let's take a minute and connect this event to the story of the Bible:
 - a. How does this event fulfill Psalm 22, Isaiah 53, Zechariah 12:10; Exodus 12:46 and how does that fulfillment speak to the veracity of the gospel?
 - b. How does the darkness that fell over the land (v. 45) connect with other instances of darkness in the Bible, such as God's interaction with Abraham in Genesis 15 or during the plagues in Egypt (Exodus 10:22) or the day of the Lord prophecies (Amos 8:9)? What does darkness often symbolize in scripture and what does it mean for understanding of the crucifixion?
 - c. How does the mocking of Jesus as "King of the Jews" (v. 29) contrast with the true kingship described in Psalm 2 and Psalm 110? In what ways is Jesus' kingship different from earthly expectations?
- 3. Reflect on times when you have felt abandoned by God. How does Jesus' cry of abandonment on the cross inform your understanding of God's presence in your suffering? (Matthew 27:46, Psalm 22:1, Hebrews 13:5-6)
- 4. Jesus' quotation of Psalm 22 on the cross (v. 46) is profound. How does understanding this expression of forsakenness help us to trust God's sovereignty even when He seems distant in our own trials? (Psalm 22, 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 5. In what practical ways can you imitate the humility and obedience of Christ (Philippians 2:5-11) in your own life, especially in times of unjust suffering? How does the crucifixion challenge us as we are called to 'take up our cross' and follow Jesus? (Luke 9:23)
