Sermon Notes

SERMON DISCUSSION

1. Malachi begins with God's declaration of love to a doubting people (1:2). Where do you find yourself quietly saying, "How have you loved us?" — through disappointment, delay, or suffering? How would God answer?
2. Israel was bringing blind, lame, and blemished sacrifices, keeping the best for themselves (1:6-14). Where are you giving God your "leftover time," "leftover energy," or "leftover money" instead of your first and best? What is one practical change you could make this week to honor God?
3. God confronts his people for breaking faith in their closest relationships, especially marriage (2:10-16). Read how strongly God is for marriage and against divorce. Where are you tempted to be careless, harsh, or distant with the people closest to you, assuming God doesn't care as much about that as he does about "spiritual things"? Name one relationship where repentance and renewed faithfulness are needed, and what your first step could be.
4. In the middle of complaint and cynicism, there is a remnant who fear the Lord and encourage each other (3:13-4:6). Who are the people that help you remember God's character when you're discouraged? What's one way you can intentionally "speak with one another" this week, encouraging someone to trust God's coming justice and mercy instead of joining in complaint?
5. God promises a messenger who will "prepare the way" before him (3:1). In the New Testament, this is John the Baptist, who is calling people to repentance. If a "messenger" walked into your life this week and said, "Get ready — God is coming near," what would be the first area of your life that comes to mind?
6. The coming One is both terrifyingly holy (refiner's fire) and graciously committed (he sits and patiently purifies). Which side of Jesus do you tend to downplay — his holy, refining fire or his patient, covenant love?
